Formal education

Structured learning in schools and universities.

"Formal education usually leads to a recognised diploma."

Informal education

Learning that happens outside a classroom.

"Talking with grandparents is a form of informal education."

Non-formal education

Organised learning outside formal schools.

"Community workshops are examples of non-formal education."

Curriculum

The subjects taught in a school.

"The new curriculum includes more practical skills."

Literacy

The ability to read and write.

"Literacy rates have improved across the country."

CARD 06

n.

Vocational training

Training for a specific trade or profession.

"Vocational training prepares students for skilled jobs."

CARD 07

n.

Lifelong learning

Continuing to learn throughout one's life.

"Lifelong learning keeps the mind active and engaged."

CARD 08

n.

Dropout

A student who leaves school early.

"Support programmes help reduce the dropout rate."

Academic achievement

Success in schoolwork.

"Her academic achievement earned her a scholarship."

adj.

Self-taught

Having learned without formal instruction.

"He's a self-taught painter and musician."
